Each session splits into "pods" of 6-8 students with adult leaders, which learn together the entire week. Wearing masks indoors, practicing social distancing, hand-washing, campers rotate through indoor science experiments, trail checklists, outdoor parrots, Reptile Room, Sensory Garden, Butterfly House, more. Camp Shirt, take-homes, daily snacks, drinks provided.
