## Pokemon Go “Generation 2” inhabits South Texas Botanical Gardens, player discounts offered!



Three new **Pokemon Go gyms**, three **nects**, up to eight **raids** a day, and at least 10 **Pokestops** have popped up at the South Texas Botanical Gardens & Nature Center, 8545 S. Staples, in Pokemon Go, “Generation 2!”.

Show your **Pokemon Go “Trainer Profile” of level five or above** on your phone, when checking in at the Visitors Center to receive admission discounts through December 31, 2017. Adult admission, ages 13-59, will be **\$6 with the app**, \$2 off regular price. Seniors at age 60, active military and college students will reduce to **\$5**—a \$1 discount; while children three to 12 will be **\$3**, also \$1 off. Members are admitted free.

Botanical Gardens Assistant Grounds Manager **Micah Knupp**, also resident “Pokemon Master” hobbyist, reports three gyms—*South Texas Botanical Gardens*, *Monkey Mansion Treehouse*, and *Bird Watching Tower*—with at least eight raids a day. Three nests appearing throughout the day include *Eevee*, *Bulbasaur*, and *Chikorita*. Pokemon Knupp has found on site include *Bayleaf*, *Meganlum*, *Jigglypuff*—and two rare ones usually found in South America, *Heracross* and *Corsola*. (Knupp’s Pokemon knowledge was unknown when hired, turning out to be an added skillset!)

Players are expected to stay on the walkways, stay alert, be courteous to other guests, and observe 9 am to 6 pm visitor hours. Trespassing off-hours and stepping in lakes, ponds or wetlands are prohibited. Information, 361-852-2100.
