Earning her undergraduate degree at University of Texas at Austin; doing post-graduate work in photography at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, Rogers also studied with artists in France, Hungary, India, Morocco, Russia, Spain; Washington, California, Santa Fe, New York City and Austin.

"The heart of my work is environmental advocacy, seductively exposing the real and devastating effects of plastic pollution on the world's oceans. The intent of my work is to raise awareness of this pressing consumer and environmental issue, while motivating viewers toward a plastic-use reduction revolution. BIRDIEST FESTIVAL IN AMERICA announces 2023 Keynote!

You don't have to be a birder to be fascinated by the sixth Birdiest Festival in America's keynote speaker, Tiffany Kersten! Her story of winning 2021 "The Big Year," sighting 726 bird species in 12 months, was Texas Monthly's June cover story.

Circumstances of her win were amazing! The 35-year-old guide from Mission, recovering from sexual assault, losing her nature center job, drove 49,000 miles in a Chevy Spark, hopped 50 flights, finding her record-breaking 'Bat Falcon' just 30 minutes from home, December 18. She narrates her adventure in nitty-gritty detail, every mile done on a shoe string, meanwhile somehow healing from past events as she camped out, slept in the car, keeping in touch with birding friends for tips where to head next.

Registration for the 2023 Festival, April 26-30, opens December 1 at BIRDIESTFESTIVAL.ORG. Watch for it and reserve your seat for this mesmerizing experience.

Numbers for 2022's Festival showed 239 registrants from 30 states, a 47 percent increase, raising the number of species seen in its five-year history to 329!

Geared to kids, 115 bales of hay will create an "hay-mazing" adventure challenging young sense of direction. Near Monkey Mansion play area, the Hay Maze, quite a hit last fall, will be open 9 am-6 pm, beginning October 22, decorated with at least six "Scary Crows" for Halloween by 15 Ocean Drive Garden Club volunteers; transforming to a holiday vibe for Holly-Days! Just one bale high, parents can keep an eye on kids while inside.

One large round bale will be set up for photo ops! Hay Maze is included in general admission. The Gardens will close Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Eve and Day.

New "Texas-sized" Texas Tortoise Pen built for Eagle Scout Project!

Scout Noah Smith and Troop 226 built a deluxe condominium of sorts for all our adult and young Texas Tortoises this summer, as Noah's Eagle Project! Twice the size of their former home, its features include additional protection from wildlife with a smaller wire mesh. Its size allows Animal Care staff walk-in flexibility for care and feeding. Tortoises are separated by size and gender, preventing reproduction according to Texas Parks & Wildlife Department permit requirements.

Texas Tortoises in residence include aptly-named adults *Dallas* (only female), *Houston* and *Austin*; and more youthful *Tyler*, *Beau* and *Richardson*! Visit the enclosure—built with in-kind contributions from H-E-B, and Victory Building—just past the Butterfly House along the tree line between Hummingbird Garden and Monkey Mansion Kids Play Area. The large Sulcata Tortoises are housed separately.
