















Another Bouligny Matching Challenge Grant comes our way . . .

Spring completion expected for new S. Oso Parkway entrance

Lots of heavy equipment and crew are working on construction of S. Oso Parkway at S. Staples St., a new and safer entrance to the Botanical Gardens! Road bed is in, curb/gutter underway, and adjacent Education Building parking lot drainage is going in. The entrance road will curve right approaching a decorative gate to current parking. The project was part of the city's 2018 bond package. Contractor is A. Ortiz Construction & Paving, Inc.

Being further west of the current entrance, S. Oso Parkway gives much improved sight distance of cars coming off Oso Creek bridge, often at high speeds. Leaving the Gardens, left, right and straight-ahead exit lanes will expedite traffic flow.

Another shade structure added for groups using Kids Play Area

Child-friendly donor Joyce Barnette has underwritten a 20 x 40-foot shade structure in the Kids Play Area for families and groups watching their children or enjoying picnic lunches. Identical to the dark green canvas awning behind the Rose Garden, Play Area fencing will surround it, with some comfortable seating added. It also overlooks Monkey Mansion Treehouse, donated by Joyce several years ago—one of the most popular kids spots!


