## Botanical Gardens says no BIG BLOOM this year!

The South Texas Botanical Gardens & Nature Center has announced its popular BIG BLOOM Plant Sale won't happen this year, due to drought-caused water shortages and resulting watering restrictions. BIG BLOOM usually is held the first Saturday in April drawing 4000-5000 people.

"We can't in good conscience ask people to purchase plants at a fundraiser, wondering if they can water them enough to get established, when the entire community is in water-saving mode," explained Marketing Director MaryJane Crull.

Crull says the staff normally would be well into event planning by now, but attendance could drop, sponsors may be reluctant, and public perception is important. "We conserve our natural resources. Ignoring our critical water situation is not the image we want to project," she emphasized.



"As a botanical garden, we try to be the example of good environmental stewardship, especially with low water supplies," added Executive Director Michael Womack. We don't want our residents to feel they have to buy plants to support us this year," he concluded.
