Experience Monarchs overwintering in Central Mexico, eight days / seven nights

f experiencing Monarch Butterflies in their Mexican sanctuary forests is on your bucket list, then this exciting travel offering is for you!

The South Texas Botanical Gardens is coordinating a trip to central Mexico, February 10-18, to experience the amazing natural phenomenon of overwintering monarchs having made their annual migratory trek to the mountains of Central Mexico! Visiting these critically endangered forested habitats are thrilling for many nature-enthusiasts, who also will learn the culture of surrounding villages working to protect these environmentally sensitive spaces.



SIGN UP NOW. The window for reservations closes July 1, only 12 spaces available!

THE EXPERIENCE: Bilingual field trip guides are available throughout the trip. The Monarch Experience begins the first night with an educational program, before venturing to three different monarch sanctuaries. (Most other trips focus on one or two locations). This trip is considered *moderate to highly active* by other tour groups. After an **initial air-conditioned van ride with professional driver to each sanctuary, visiting the monarch sites then requires hiking and horseback rides** (*platforms used for easy mounting*) **led by local guides** (*ejidatarios*).







ACCOMODATIONS, MEALS, TIPS: Double-occupancy rooms at a Bed & Breakfast in Macheros, with pool and hot tub! **Seven breakfasts and dinners** are included, with **box lunches provided for field trips**. Single occupancy available for additional \$995. Unlike many tour operators, this trip **includes tips for hotel staff, field trips guides, drivers, and of course purified water refills.**

MORE THAN MONARCHS: Also included are cultural experiences including a trip to pyramids of Teotihuacan and regional Mercado visit, tour of local avocado orchard, authentic regional Mexican cooking class, Machuros cottage industry and local museum tour. Experience the village culture in an immersion into this mountain village of Central Mexico.

COST: \$4695 plus tax (double occupancy) — plus Airfare to Mexico City (approximately \$520-\$700).

Oso Creek Loop Trail, connecting Wetland Boardwalk to lowland creek wildlife areas, goes from ragged grass-lined path to 10-foot A.D.A. raised hard-surface!

The 4000-foot Oso Creek Loop Trail connecting the Boardwalk, large wetland and Oso Creek banks, is now an attractive 10-foot A.D.A. accessible walkway, for scenic hiking and exploring lowland wildlife areas! When the end of the Wetland Boardwalk is raised to meet new trail elevation, trash receptacles, benches and distance markers are planned so walkers have a continuous loop from upper exhibit areas, along the Brennecke Nature Trail to the Boardwalk, Oso Loop Trail and back. The new trail is accessible ONLY during regular 9 am- 6 pm business hours. Contractor *WyldByrd's Construction* dug out several inches of surface for a compacted crushed concrete base, topping with rolled decomposed crushed granite, covered by G3 trail stabilizer to prevent washout in the lowland floodplain.

Funded in 2020 from a \$250,000 Texas Parks & Wildlife Department grant, and \$89,000 City of Corpus Christi Type B "match" with help from Mayor Paulette Guajardo, COVID slowed plan approvals, inspection, and archeological survey to inspect for burial remains.









Six-foot aluminum fencing and gates added along new S. Oso Parkway entrance

pening new S. Oso Parkway also opened up the west side of Gardens property, remedied with decorative six-foot aluminum fencing, matching front sections, two walk-through gates and a double lane rear entrance gate to Visitors Center parking. Security cameras and extra lighting also were installed. The \$71,000 fencing project was funded by Coastal Bend Community Foundation, Earl C. Sams Foundation and Estate of Jo Gilbert Palmer.

The city built the planned extension not only to connect parkway sections, but also to move our entrance west off the dangerous Staples St. bridge curve. Within the street project accelerated by Mayor Paulette Guajardo as part of Bond 2018, was a parking lot for school buses and those attending meetings in Education Station.

New S. Oso Parkway soon becomes sole entrance to the Botanical Gardens through the new rear gate! When new entrance signage is installed, the current front gate on Staples Street will be closed except to emergency traffic.



Sabbath Hoss, home-schooled and graduating high school, plans to pursue an Animal Biology degree.






